ANimal libERaTION

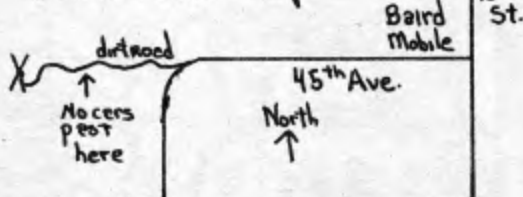
