English and journalism professor Jeffrey Miller is excited about the change in elevation.


"I think it's really important that our students are closer to God in both the spiritual and physical sense," Miller said.

Freshman Nathan Dehnert said, "For some it's devolved into a dorm versus dorm scenario. It is sad to see such a great environment become so unstable."




in which applicants were asked


to play "Mary Jane's Last Dance"
